1. INTRODUCTION

The Media, Information and Communication Technologies Sector Education and Training Authority ("MICT SETA") is established in terms of section 9(1) of the Skills Development Act, 1998 (Act No. 97 of 1998), and is responsible for achieving South Africa's skills development and economic growth within the following five sub-sectors: advertising, film and electronic media, electronics, information technology and telecommunications.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

Background and Rationale

As the MICT SETA continues to align with the Fourth Industrial Revolution, it has become increasingly important to reflect the organisation's commitment to digital transformation through visible and innovative initiatives. Humanoid robots are a demonstration of automation and can be used as versatile research and educational tools that embody the core principles of 4IR and bridge the gap between AI and tangible real-world application.

They embody the fusion of digital and physical worlds, and the use of advanced technologies like AI and robotics. Their capacity to engage with humans and carry out various tasks makes them a clear representation of 4IR's focus on technological innovation and automation. The procurement of a humanoid robot solidifies MICT SETA as a trendsetter and pioneer in the 4IR skills development and Research and Development space, showcasing its innovation-driven culture, while also enhancing the various engagements hosted by the MICT SETA.

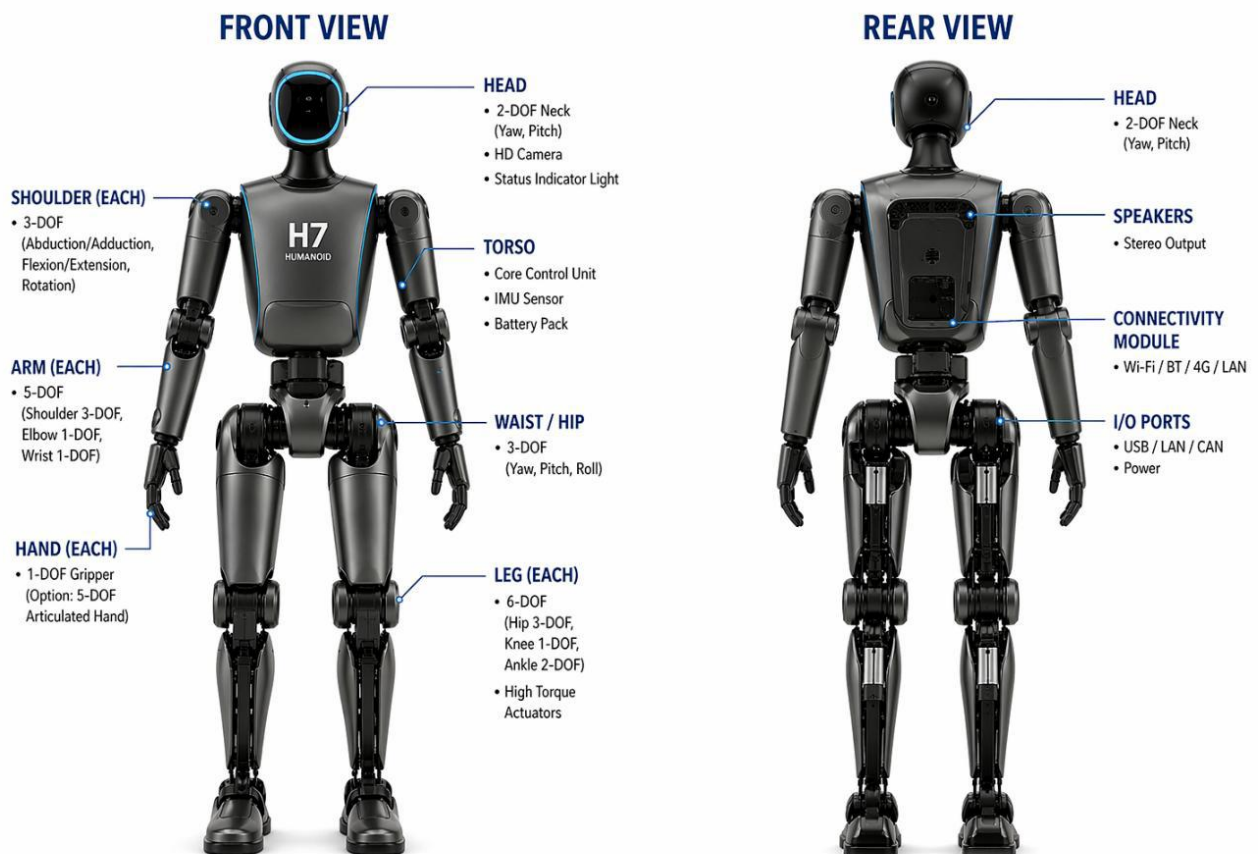

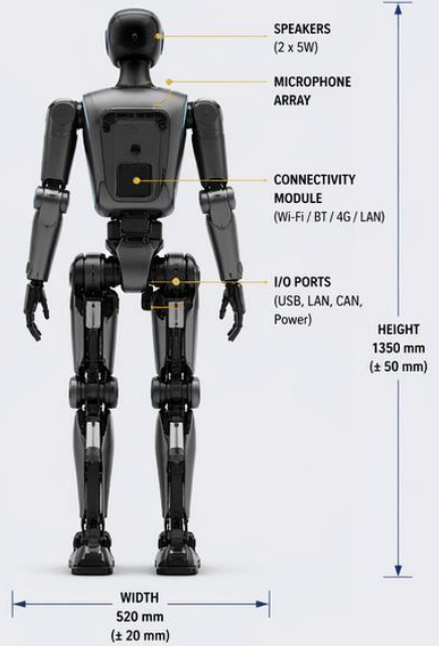

5. EVALUATION CRITERIA

The bidder must be an OEM/OSM or authorised Distributor or authorised by the OEM/distributor to supply, configure and support the proposed Humanoid Robot.
