1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Purpose of the RFI

The purpose of this Request for Information (RFI) is to conduct market research on available Laboratory Information Systems (LIS), with the aim of understanding vendor capabilities, solution maturity, and alignment with NHLS operational and strategic requirements.

This RFI is not a request for proposal (RFP) and does not constitute a commitment to procure.

2. BACKGROUND

The National Health Laboratory Service (NHLS), established in 2000 through an Act of Parliament, provides diagnostic pathology services to South Africa's public healthcare sector. Its core functions include:

- Diagnostic laboratory services
- Research
- Teaching and training
- Production of reagents, media, and anti-snake venom

The NHLS operates:

- 268 laboratories nationwide, covering all healthcare levels
- 4 Forensic Chemistry Laboratories recently incorporated.

3. CURRENT ENVIRONMENT

A single, centralised LIS is deployed across all the NHLS laboratories.

Daily test volumes

- Average: 405,000
- Peak: 520,000
- Weekend: 214,000

Analyser integration

- Over 1,400 analysers interfaced

Test catalogue

- 2,400+ tests across multiple disciplines

Users

- 5,300 internal users
- Approx. 20,000 external users daily

4.2. Technical Requirements

Architecture & Performance

- Single, authoritative data source
- Minimum 99.9% system availability
- Scalable to support ≥5% annual growth
- Capable of handling peak workloads without performance degradation
- Expected solution lifespan: 10 years minimum

High Availability

- No single point of failure
- Active-active or equivalent high-availability architecture
- Secondary site capable of handling full production load
- Automated failover and failback capabilities
- Vendors must describe architecture options with benefits, risks, and cost implications

- Proven integration capability with heterogeneous systems

- Must comply with, at minimum:
 - ISO 27001:2022
 - ISO 27002:2022
 - ISO 27799
 - Protection of Personal Information Act (POPIA)

Additional requirements:

- Tiered confidentiality for sensitive tests/patients

Support

- 24/7 support model required
- Clearly defined SLAs

- Private cloud
- Public cloud
- Hybrid

Include:

- Recommended approach for NHLS
- Minimum infrastructure requirements
- Network and latency requirements
