TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER TO
SUPPLY AND INSTALL AN ALARM SYSTEM AND PROVIDE ARMED RESPONSE AT
THE CSOS GEORGE SATELLITE OFFICE, FOR TWELVE MONTHS.

1. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This Request for Proposal (RFP) has been compiled by the CSOS and is made available to Bidders subject to the following terms and conditions, which Bidders are deemed to acknowledge and accept:

- 1.1. A Quotation submitted in response to this RFP will constitute a binding offer that will remain binding and irrevocable for a period of ninety (90) days from the date of submission to the CSOS.
- 1.2. Unless or until a binding contract is concluded between the CSOS and the successful Bidder, the offer constituted by the quotation will be deemed not to have been accepted and no agreement will be deemed to be reached with any Bidder.
- 1.3. The CSOS reserves the right to amend, modify, withdraw or terminate this RFP or any of the requirements set out herein at any time (and from time to time), without prior notice and without liability to compensate or reimburse any Bidder or person.
- 1.4. Should this RFP be amended, the CSOS undertakes to publicize or send each Bidder in writing the amended RFP. No oral amendments by the Bidder or the CSOS shall be considered.
- 1.5. It is compulsory for a Bidder submitting a quotation to be registered on the National Treasury's Central Supplier Database ("the CSD") and ensure that it remains registered for the duration of the services and/or contract, if successful.
- 1.6. The Bidder needs to ensure that it is tax compliant at the time of submitting its quotation and remains tax compliant for the duration of the contract and/or services, if successful, and undertakes to provide supporting documentation issued by the South African Revenue Services ("SARS") confirming it is tax compliant upon request by the CSOS.
- 1.7. The CSOS reserves the right to conduct site inspections or call for supporting documentation to confirm any information provided by a Bidder in its response to this quotation.
- 1.8. This RFP is not intended to form the basis of a decision to enter into any transaction with the CSOS and does not constitute an offer or recommendation to enter into such transaction, or an intention to enter into any legal relationship with any person.
- 1.9. Neither the CSOS nor any of its respective directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives, or advisors will assume any responsibility for any costs or expenses incurred by any party in or associated with preparing or submitting a quotation in response to this RFP.

- 1.10. No entity or associated entities may be involved, whether directly or indirectly, in more than one quotation in response to this RFP. Failure to comply with this requirement may, within the sole discretion of the CSOS, result in disqualification of both entities.
- 1.11. Any material changes in the control and/or composition of any Bidder or any core member of a Bidder after submission of a quotation must be brought to the attention of the CSOS Supply Chain Management ("SCM") Section in writing. The CSOS shall be the sole arbiter as to what constitutes a material change in the control and/or composition of any Bidder and may in its sole discretion disqualify the Bidder from any further participation in the bid process.
- 1.12. Any requirement set out in this RFP which stipulates the form and/or content of any aspect of a quotation is stipulated for the sole benefit of the CSOS, and unless the contrary is expressed, may be waived by the CSOS in its sole discretion at any stage in the bid process.
- 1.13. The CSOS and its advisors shall rely on a quotation as being accurate and complete about the information and proposals provided therein by the Bidders.
- 1.14. All quotations submitted to CSOS shall become the property of the CSOS and will not be returned to the Bidders. The CSOS will make all reasonable efforts to maintain the information contained in proposals confidentially.
- 1.15. Quotations submitted by the Bidder shall be considered non-responsive if they show any omissions or irregularities of any kind. However, the CSOS reserves the right to waive any aspect of non-responsiveness and to make an award in the best interest of the organization provided that any such waiver shall be applied consistently across all Bidders.
- 1.16. The CSOS reserves the right to accept or reject in part or whole any submitted quotation submitted.
- 1.17. The CSOS reserves the right to require a Bidder to provide a formal presentation of its RFP at a date and time to be determined by the CSOS. The CSOS shall provide adequate instructions and clarification regarding the purpose and scope of the presentation. All expenses shall be borne by the Bidder.
- 1.18. In this RFP, the words "service provider", and "supplier" will be used interchangeably to refer to the Bidder.
- 1.19. All costs associated with the preparation and submission of the quotation remain the responsibility of the Bidder. The costs shall not be chargeable to the CSOS by the successful or unsuccessful Bidder.

- 1.20. All quotations must be formulated and submitted according to the requirements of this RFP.
- 1.21. Quotations received after the closing date and time as specified in this RFP shall be rejected.
- 1.22. The CSOS is not obliged to appoint a bidder with the lowest price, if, based on its sole discretion and assessment, the said bidder does not exhibit or demonstrate adequate capacity or full comprehension of the scope of work to be undertaken.
- 1.23. In this regard, CSOS may appoint the second-ranked bidder provided that the reasons for such deviation are properly justified and accurately recorded.

2. INTRODUCTION

- 2.1. The Community Schemes Ombud Services (CSOS) is established in terms of the Community Schemes Ombud Services Act 2011 (Act 9 of 2011), to regulate the conduct of parties within community schemes and to ensure good governance within community schemes. To deliver on its mandate, key amongst the key priorities of the organisation are:
 - 2.1.1. Regulations of all community schemes.
 - 2.1.2. Provision of Dispute Resolution Services.
 - 2.1.3. Quality assurance and keeping custody of schemes governance documentation.
 - 2.1.4. Providing access to schemes governance documentation to the members.
 - 2.1.5. Ensuring good governance within community schemes.

3. PROJECT BACKGROUND

- 3.1. The CSOS requires the services of an experienced security company to supply, and install an alarm system and provide armed response to its premises.
- 3.2. The CSOS must ensure that the offices are secured by the Access Control to Premises and Vehicle Act, 53 of 1985, and Minimum Physical Security Standards (MPSS).

4. PURPOSE

- 4.1. The purpose of the RFQ is to appoint a service provider to supply, and install an alarm system, and provide an armed response at the George satellite office, for twelve (12) months.

5. SCOPE OF WORK.

5.1 The scope of work is to appoint reputable service providers to provide and install an alarm system as well as provide armed response services to the CSOS George premises.

5.2 THE SERVICE PROVIDER MUST PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING TASKS:

5.2.1 supply and install an alarm system and provide an armed response at the CSOS George satellite office.

5.2.3 Provide logistics, communication links, and regular surveillance during the day.

5.3 ALARM SYSTEM SPECIFICATIONS

5.3.1 The CSOS requires a security company to supply, and install an alarm system and provide armed response services at the George satellite office as follows:

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5.3.2 For installation of the alarm system, the service provider should be a member of the South African Intruder Detection Services Association (SAIDSA). The bidder will be required to issue a certificate of compliance after the alarm system has been installed.

5.4 CONSTRUCTION

Intruder alarm system:

- a) The intruder alarm system shall consist of detection circuits, various detection devices, control equipment, one or more signalling circuits, signalling equipment and the necessary power supply equipment.
- b) Precautions against tampering.
- c) The control panel housing cover and electronic detection devices e.g. PIR, glass break, etc, must be tamper-protected in a 24-hour zone.
- d) The communication devices, antenna, control panel and power supply must be in a protected area.
- e) The detection devices and other parts of the alarm system must be mounted and located so that the possibility of interference by mechanical or magnetic means is reduced to a minimum. Where the frame of a protected door, window or other entry-exit point can be readily displaced, this displacement must create an alarm condition.
- f) Every detection circuit forming part of the intruder alarm system shall be so arranged that failure of the power supply to the circuit displays a fault condition during arming.
- g) Location and enclosure where ceiling access is possible, the control panel, radio and antenna shall be installed a minimum of 1.5 m below the ceiling, or in an area that is not vulnerable to tampering from within the ceiling void. These devices must be protected by a volumetric detector on an instant zone and must not be visible from the outside of the premises. This will not apply in the stay mode.
- h) The use of a mechanical key switch alone is prohibited.
- i) In the case of an intruder alarm system having a keypad as an integral part of the enclosure, it may not be part of the entry/exit area. In the armed state, a person must not be able to gain access to the control panel within the entry delay period.
- j) The control panel and battery must not be in an entry/exit delay zone. It is recommended that remote arming or a second keypad be used.
- k) The client must be informed of any possible risks associated with the use of remote arming.
- l) Disarm when using a time delay on a zone protecting the keypad, such entry delay shall not exceed 30 seconds.

- m) Arming during the arming period procedure the status of all isolated circuits or faulted circuits shall be easily accessible.
- n) Circuit Identification
- o) Bypass/Isolation once armed, no bypassed zones shall be indicated on the keypad.
- p) The battery charger shall be sufficient to recharge the battery to the required capacity within 24 hours.
- q) All power supply equipment shall be correctly earthed according to the manufacturer's instructions using electrical earth.

5.5 AUDIBLE SOUNDERS

- a) The audible sounders shall be capable of sounding for a minimum period of three (3) minutes and must comply with the relevant regulations.
- b) All sounders must be audible unless agreed to in writing between the client and the installation company.
- c) External sounders shall have their cables monitored for tamper by the control panel. The signalling equipment systems must be linked to the central stations/control rooms.
- d) Minimum signals i.e. burglary and panic must be monitored separately. The radio transmitter and antenna must be correctly installed to the manufacturer's specifications.
- e) All communication equipment shall be approved by the relevant bodies.
- f) Where any communication mediums are vulnerable or unreliable, a second or alternate method of signalling must be used.

5.6 ARMED RESPONSE SERVICES

- 5.6.2.1 The Armed Response Security Company must work closely with existing law enforcement services/agencies such as the neighbouring Community Policing Forums, the Traffic Department, and the South African Police Service.
- 5.6.2.2 The Security Company must be PSIRA (Private Security Industry Regulatory Authority) compliant with sufficient experience in armed response services.
- 5.6.2.3 Provide quick armed response services of between 1 and 5 minutes after receiving alarm activation.
- 5.6.2.4 Must have an existing patrolling vehicle within a radius of about 5km away from the CSOS George office to respond on time.
- 5.6.2.5 Maintain and repair all alarm systems in the building.

- 5.6.2.6 Ensure compatibility with the alarm system to allow for notification of any alarm activation to the client (linked to cell phones)
- 5.6.2.7 Ensure that the alarm system is linked to the service provider's control room for armed reaction and monitoring purposes.
- 5.6.2.8 The Security companies applying for this contract must be operating in the George area and have the armed response stationed in the area for quick response in less than 5 minutes as mentioned above.
- 5.6.2.9 The Security Company will comply with all relevant government legislations such as the Basic Condition of Employment, Labour Relations Act etc. as well as to comply with CSOS terms and conditions, including the signed service level agreement.

5.7 MAINTENANCE SERVICES.

- 5.7.2 Bidders must provide proof of public liability insurance cover of at least R5 million. Please note that any losses/ damages incurred by CSOS because of negligence by the security company or any breach in the conditions listed above may result in CSOS terminating the contract (by the provisions of the service level agreement or, CSOS reserves the right to withhold such damages from amounts payable to the service provider. Upon discovery of such damages/ losses, the armed response personnel will be required to report the incident to their immediate supervisor who will then notify the CSOS project manager.
- 5.7.3 The CSOS project manager will be responsible for opening a case at the local police station for investigation.
- 5.7.4 If during the term of appointment, it comes to the attention of CSOS, that any of the provisions listed above are not being complied with, CSOS reserves the right to terminate the services of the service provider by provisions of the Service Level Agreement that will be entered into upon appointment.

6. PROJECT TIME FRAME

- 6.1 The provision of these security services will be for twelve (12) months and will commence after the signing of the service level agreement.

7. MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

- 7.1 The proposals will be evaluated in three phases. The first phase is the Mandatory Requirements, the second phase will be site inspection/ due diligence and the third phase will price and specific goals. Bidders that meet all the mandatory and site inspection requirements will be further evaluated on price and specific goals.

7.2 MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

Bidders will be disqualified if they fail to meet any of the mandatory criteria below.
